- Red Day
- Properties impacted both in Lake Cathie and Lake Innes with evacuations of residents
- Rural communities impacted in the surrounding valleys where communities such as Debenham, Bellangry, Pappinbarra, Forbes River, Birdwood and Yarras received significant damage









2019/2020 fire season impacts for PMHC

- Dwellings lost and destroyed
- Community buildings, bridges lost
- Air quality and health impacts
- Incidental Evacuation places
- Community Spirit

- Recovery meetings
- Immediate road and bridge repairs were identified and works undertaken to ensure rural communities were connected
- Council rates relief (and still ongoing)
- Resilience Scholarships with Charles Sturt University
- Connection with all the interagencies- gathering of information & funding still available to share with communities








What's next in creating a more resilient community
